In the summer of 2014, the Refo500 Train connects the most important places of the Calvinistic and Lutheran Reformation in Europe. Starting from Lutherstadt Wittenberg the train includes visits to Eisleben, Nordhausen. Wartburg Castle, Heidelberg, and Zurich before reaching Geneva for the commemoration of John Calvin, on the 450<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his death. Strasbourg and Leuven will be additional stops before the final destination: Dordrecht.

The **Refo500 Train** combines great travel experiences at the **Reformation Sites in Europe** with ecumenical fellowship and the knowledge of leading experts. While the train brings the travelers safely and comfortably to each stop, rail cruise participants enjoy the time meeting one another, simply walking around and chatting in the day coaches and lounge cars. Introductions and lectures will be given by international Reformation experts, teachers, and

professors on the train, with workshops and presentations available in the meeting areas. After arrival at the various locations, sightseeing options, study programs, museums and receptions welcome the guests. Overnight stays are in local hotels.

Leading experts of Reformation history and theology turn the **Refo500 Train** into an unparalleled study experience. Among the 200 rail travelers will be **In-Sub Ahn** (Presbyterian General Assembly Theological Seminary, South Korea), **Timothy George** (Samford

University, USA), Robert Godfrey (Westminster Seminary California, USA), Michael Havkin (The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, USA), Peter Lillback (Westminster Theological Seminary Philadelphia, USA), Thomas Seidel (Internationale Martin Luther Stiftung, Germany), Herman Selderhuis (Theological University of Apeldoorn, director of Refo500, Netherlands), and Hans Wiersma (Augsburg College, USA). Michael Bridges and George Baum (LOST AND FOUND, USA) will provide fun, faith-based and liturgical music.
